In addition to serving the needs of our current program participants, our goal is to reach other persons with IDD and who have musical and artistic gifts who might otherwise be isolated in a restrictive environment that does not allow for their overall growth, and to provide for the development of their gifts and for an outlet to express them creatively and productively.

PROGRAM SERVICES

Creative Identity is Orange County's premier music therapy and expressive arts day program serving adults with developmental disabilities.

We offer year-round services Monday - Friday between 8:30am - 2:30pm.

Music Therapy

At the heart of Creative Identity is song! Guided by professional, Board Certified Music Therapists, our program participants find the melody of life.

Therapeutic goals include:

- Improving attention & participation
- Increasing self expression & decision making
- Increasing fine & gross motor coordination
- Improving social interactions & interpersonal skills

Life Skills

Our life skills classes empowers our program participants to feel more competent, confident, and independent within the community. Some of our classes include community safety, clients' rights, nutrition, exercise, conflict resolution, money management, and academic skills.

Prevocational Training

Our program participants can participate in Creative Identity's Prevocational Growth Initiative program. Program participants are able to earn commissions from the sale of their art and ceramic pieces at art exhibitions and local craft fairs. With staff coaching, program participants receive a practical education in interacting with the public by presenting their art to the community at large and making sales transactions.

Ceramics

Our ceramics program is one of a kind! Our program participants' pieces are prepared on-site and fired in our kiln. We provide a supportive and encouraging environment where our program participants have the opportunity to experiment and meaningfully expand their artistic ideas. All of our glazes are non-toxic, lead free, and food-safe.

Expressive Arts

Our expressive arts program instills the values of work, offers a chance for skill development, and cultivates a sense of pride for what they can do. Class include the mediums of paintings, drawing, ceramics, silk-painting, animation and photography and address individualized goals such as fine and gross motor skills, self-expression, stress management, and self-esteem. Participant artwork and ceramic ware has been featured at the Muzeo Museum and Cultural Center and VSA.

Learning Styles

At Creative Identity is sensitive to the fact that each individual has a different way of learning. Our program incorporates visual, auditory, and kinesthetic learning tools to maximize each program participants' full potential of success. Our highly skilled and trained professionals used clinical and evidence-based interventions to accomplish personalized goals.
